INSTRUMENTAL CLASSES

8 a.m. Reedmaking for Double Reed Players Instructor: Elizabeth Young Rennick, Grade 8+. Come learn the delicate art of reed-making while working along other oboe and bassoon players. All double reed players — beginners and professionals alike — are welcome. Each enrollee's fee provides materials for two reeds to be completed during the week. More cane will be available for purchase. Better reeds change lives, and this class is a life-changer! Class materials fee - \$12.

9 a.m. Brass Technique Instructor: Seretta Hart, Grade 7+. Brass players, want to achieve your best? This class is designed to help you learn great technique, get the most out of your practice time, and play the music you've always wanted to play.

9 a.m. Clarinet Technique Instructor: Sam Noyce, Grade 7+. Enroll in this class to build essential clarinet technique, including articulation, embouchure building, fingering, breathing air support, and creating a characteristic tone on the instrument.

9 a.m. Double Reeds Technique Instructor: Elizabeth Young Rennick, Grade 7+. Take your playing to the next level with this interactive course designed with your needs, abilities, and interests in mind. Enhancing basic skills such as tone production, articulation, and technique will add pleasure to every concert. Past players have enjoyed learning techniques beyond the basics such as circular breathing, double-tonguing, and multi-phonics. Come experience a dynamic class and leave a better player!

9 a.m. Flute Technique Instructor: Stacey Corbett, Grade 7+. Learn the art and joy of practicing. (No, that is not an oxymoron.) We will explore the difference between de-constructive and constructive practicing. You will gain the skills to grow and develop your flute technique well beyond the last day of class.

9 a.m. Intermediate Percussion Ensemble Instructor: David Thalmann, Grades 7-8. Learning to meld and blend harsh percussion instruments starts here. We'll start from the beginning and make those instruments sound like an angel choir.

9 a.m. Saxophone Technique Instructor: Gary Glass, Grade 7+. This class will be dedicated to fundamental concepts of playing saxophone. You will work on these skills with the instructor while mastering the music you are already working on.

10 a.m. Advanced Percussion Ensemble Instructor: David Thalmann, Grade 9+. Not only do we create music you can feel, but you can see it as well. It's total entertainment in one package. Previous experience in percussion is not necessary; however, a willing mind is always appreciated. Also, if you have your own mallets and/or sticks, please bring them.

10 a.m. Brass Technique/Brass Ensemble Instructor: Seretta Hart, Grade 9+. Hone your technique and progress toward virtuosity and experience the opportunity to enjoy brass ensemble playing. We have a wide variety of literature to explore and will have a blast playing it together. All brass players deserve to enjoy the experience of blending and harmonizing in a brass ensemble.

10 a.m. Clarinet Technique/Ensemble Instructor: Sam Noyce, Grade 8+. In this performance-oriented master class, we will improve clarinet technique and musicality while preparing for a performance at the end of the week.

10 a.m. Double Reed Technique/Ensemble Instructor: Elizabeth Young Rennick, Grade 9+. Oboes and bassoons change the world by playing beautiful music together. Come play in one of the coolest consorts at camp. Repertoire will be adjusted to the levels of players so everyone is challenged but successful. Have a favorite piece you want to play in double-reed ensemble? Enroll and email me to see if we can make it happen this year.

10 a.m. Flute Technique/Ensemble Instructor: Stacey Corbett, Grade 9+. This is not your ordinary ensemble class. Besides performing, we will explore transposition, arranging music, and playing by ear. This class will perform at the end of the week.

10 a.m. Saxophone Technique/Ensemble Instructor: Gary Glass, Grade 9+. Fundamental concepts of good tone production and intonation will be the focus of this class's technique portion. Learn about embouchure, mouthpieces, breathing, choosing good reeds, and intonation strategies. Students will practice these concepts on music from other camp ensembles, as well as at least one saxophone ensemble selection that will be prepared in this class.

11 a.m. Jazz Band Instructor: Eric Hansen, Grade 9+. Rehearse and learn some fun jazz tunes in a variety of styles.

1 p.m. Jazz Improv Instructor: Gary Glass, Grades 7-8. The blues is a great way to start to improvise. Anyone interested in learning to make up music up on the fly is welcome! Although we'll be working in a "band" key, any instrumentalist is eligible to join this class as long as they can play their Bb Concert Major Scale.

3 p.m. Broadway! Life in the Pits Instructor: Eric Hansen, Grade 9+. The bright lights and glamour of the Broadway star are enticing — but what about the musicians that provide all the music? We class will explore what it's like in a pit orchestra/band and will learn some of the songs that have made Broadway famous.

3 p.m. Intermediate Rock Drums Instructor: Kevin Moore, Grade 7+. Stuck in the same old beats? Looking for a way to step up your fills? Then come hang out and learn ways to improve upon your existing grooves while discovering new ones.

3 p.m. Jazz Improv Instructor: Gary Glass, Grade 9+. You've learned the blues scale — you're all over it — but you're ready to start to understand those chord symbols! The focus of this class will be to start to learn what these symbols mean by working on an improvised solo on a jazz standard or two. Students need to be able to play major scales in multiple keys; some experience improvising will be very helpful, but most important is a desire to play jazz.

4 p.m. Beginning Rock Drums Instructor: Kevin Moore, Grade 7+. Time to unleash your inner rocker! Grab your sticks and get ready to learn the basics grooves and fills that will start you on your path to being the backbone to any rocking band!

ORCHESTRA AND STRINGS

9 a.m. Cello Technique Instructor: Sam Runolfson, Grade 9+. Bring a prepared work to play for the class, where you'll have the chance to give and get feedback in a masterclass style format. We will also work on scales and exercises to improve playing, as well as sight-reading, chamber music, and ensemble skills. If you have questions, feel free to contact me.

9 a.m. String Bass Technique Instructor: Eric Hansen, Grade 7+. It's all about that bass! From the end pin to the scroll, and everything in between (including the player), learn technique, repertoire, and classical and jazz styles. After all, it's all 'bout that bass, 'bout that bass.

9 a.m. Violin & Viola Technique Instructor: Rebecca Lomnick, Grade 9 +. Have you been playing violin or viola at least three years in school orchestra? This is a master class designed to improve your skills in intonation, bowing, sight reading, solo performance, and ensemble leadership. Come with at least one solo piece prepared to play and workshop.

10 a.m. Cello Technique Instructor: Sam Runolfson, Grades 7-8. We will work on basic cello technique, scales, exercises, and beginning repertoire. Music will be provided for the class. For maximum fun, come prepared with a willingness to work and build on concepts taught each day.

10 a.m. Chamber Orchestra Instructor: James Arbizu, Grade 9 +. Chamber orchestra is not for the faint of heart. We play real music and push hard for high quality and genuine expression. We will play a light and fun classical piece and a quality 'popular' piece from the modern era. If you play a string instrument and are itching to make great music, this is the place for you.

10 a.m. Violin & Viola Technique Instructor: Rebecca Lomnick, Grades 7-8. If you've played at least one year in school orchestra, come learn about the basics in violin/viola technique while still keeping the fun in music making! We will focus on intonation, bowing, sight reading, rhythm reading, and ensemble leadership. We will also talk about basic elements of music theory, such as key signatures, forms of scales, and musical notation.

11 a.m. Non Traditional Strings Technique Instructor: Sam Runolfson, Grade 8 +. Ready to stretch beyond the classics? Come work with us on beginning and intermediate non-traditional string techniques, including chopping, chord patterns, rhythms for various styles of music, pizzicato, and arco techniques. Come with an open mind and be ready to apply what you learn all kinds of music. We'll focus on the accompaniment side of non-traditional music but will also learn melodic concepts.

1 p.m. Symphony Orchestra Instructor: Eric Hansen, Grade 9 +. Come and enjoy the big, full sound of the symphony! Let's learn some fun repertoire for the orchestra, discovering the thrills, beauty, and passion that come along with it.

2 p.m. Metal Band Instructor: Sam Runolfson, Grade 9 +. Students in this class (strings only!) will have the opportunity to work on VERY non-traditional music. The music will be challenging and selected to match the ensemble. This group is expected to perform at the end of the week. Join this high level ensemble and be ready TO ROCK OUT! Music will be provided. This ensemble has been fun and challenging every year, and it promises to be a fun, challenging week with some "hardcore" music!

VOCAL, THEATRE AND DANCE

8 a.m. Flash Mob Instructor: Shaun Parry, Grade 6 +. What if life were like a musical and normal people burst into song and dance at random? What if you were one of those people? Learn a musical number and perform it — in public! Take your talents to the streets in this hilarious class that takes "performance" to a whole new level.

9 a.m., 10 a.m. Sketch! Comedy Writing Instructor: Katrina Phillip, Grade 8 +. Laugh out loud! We'll learn the tricks to making others laugh in this class. Bring a notebook and a writing utensil along with a good sense of humor. This is a two-hour block class.

9 a.m. Vocal Harmonies Instructor: Shaun Parry, Grade 8 +. Singing solo is great, but nothing compares to voices intertwining to create beautiful harmonies. Rarely will you perform in a musical that does not require harmony singing. Learn the basics of how harmonies work and practice harmonies ranging from simple to tight and complex. We will create a tapestry of voices like you have never experienced before.

9 a.m. Theater Makeup - Scars and Wounds Instructor: Chontelle Gray, Grades 6-8. Want to shock your friends? Come learn about stage makeup and how to create interesting effects such as bruising, abrasions, scars, cuts and other interesting wounds. Bring an old shirt or clothes that can get messy, because you might get makeup on your clothes. Note: We will be using liquid latex for some of the special effects; if you have a latex sensitivity, let the instructor know so something different can be used. Class materials fee - \$10.

10 a.m. Teen Mini Melodrama Instructor: Paula Egan-Wright, Grades 6-8. Are you a drama queen (or king)? Live it up with this mini melodrama for teens and tweens — "Gopher Junction"! In five short days, we will memorize a script, develop blocking, rehearse the acting, erect a set, and put on costumes for a final run, which we will film so student performances are recorded for posterity! Class materials fee - \$2.

10 a.m. Popular Music Choir Instructor: Tara Johnson, Grade 6 +. If you love to sing, then this class is for you! Come join in as we learn to sing fun and exciting a cappella songs while developing your voice and choral techniques. You will be sure to enjoy singing with others as we prepare to perform at the concert at the end of camp.

11 a.m. Chamber Choir Instructor: Tara Johnson, Grade 9 +. This intermediate vocal ensemble allows you to develop ensemble and musicianship skills through studying advanced vocal literature for more experienced vocalists. We will learn fun and exciting music that will challenge your choral skills while having fun along the way! Don't let the name fool you! Get ready to jump in and sing your heart out!

11 a.m. Latin Dance Instructor: Shaun Parry, Grade 6 +. What makes the salsa, merengue, samba, mambo, che-cha, rumba, and bolero so fun and sexy? They are all based on the Latin dance style!

11 a.m. Theater Scenic Design Instructor: Chontelle Gray, Grade 6 +. Come design theater scenes with us. We will explore the elements of design, create models using music as our inspiration. We will create visual interpretations of music while using light and vantage as part of our design approaches. Each student will have a completed model when finished. If you have a listening device and headphones, bring them to class for inspiration. Class materials fee - \$8.

1 p.m. Acting Necessities Instructor: Shaun Parry, Grade 7 +. Thinking about being on TV or in plays? Come learn the most important techniques and tools for every actor, tricks for overcoming nervousness, and how to prepare for an audition or a play! Practice your skills with a unique piece chosen for you, try out dialogue

from real movies and commercials, and give it all in an in-class performance on the last day.

1 p.m. Dance Styles Instructor: Katrina Phillip, Grade 6 +. Each day we will explore a different dance style. Get ready to move and groove and enjoy the music!

1 p.m. Trashion Instructor: Summer Olsson, Grade 7 +. Rags to riches! Junk to jewels! Work with a professional costume designer to learn tips and tricks, then make your own couture out of up-cycled stuff. You'll be given heaps of non-traditional supplies and a Project Runway-style challenge each day. Can you create a runway-worthy look with emergency blankets and duct tape, or a school dance outfit out of netting, plastic bags, and scrap fabric? Can food become fashion? No sewing experience is necessary — only the desire to create crazy clothes! Class materials fee - \$5.

2 p.m. Theater Makeup - Scars and Wounds Instructor: Chontelle Gray, Grade 9 +. Want to shock your friends? Come learn about stage makeup and how to create interesting effects such as bruising, abrasions, scars, cuts and other interesting wounds. Bring an old shirt or clothes that can get messy, because you might get makeup on your clothes. Note: We will be using liquid latex for some of the special effects; if you have a latex sensitivity, let the instructor know so something different can be used. Class materials fee - \$10.

3 p.m. Costume Design Instructor: Chontelle Gray, Grade 7 +. Costume design is more than clothes! We'll read a short play and discuss the character and design needs for that script before choosing a few different production concepts and creating designs. In the process, we will also explore a variety of rendering techniques. Class materials fee - \$8.

3 p.m. Musical Theater 1 Instructor: Katrina Phillip, Grades 6-8. Get ready to sing, dance, and act a scene from a musical!

3 p.m. Musical Theater 2 Instructor: Shaun Parry, Grade 9 +. Broadway in Wyoming? Why not? Let's put on a show! Experience the excitement of a musical theater production directed and choreographed by a Broadway veteran. Sing, dance, and act selections from a popular Broadway musical. The class will perform at the end of the week.

4 p.m. Stage Crew Instructor: Chontelle Gray, Grade 7 +. Learn about crewing theatre productions in addition to stage management for the theater. We will discuss headset etiquette and other skills needed to manage and run a production, including the art of the efficient scene shift and other crew duties. You'll also have the opportunity to try it all out by working on the camp productions.

GUITAR

10 a.m. Folk Styles for Guitar Instructor: Adam Hende, Grade 8 +. For guitarists who have had at least one year playing experience. We'll explore the world of folk guitar, mostly through Celtic and Americana music. Each day, we'll focus on discovering new rhythmic techniques to add interest to your playing, and new chords to increase your vocabulary. We'll incorporate some basic music theory (no previous experience necessary!) and we'll learn a powerful new tuning for your guitar - DADGAD! Get ready to "folkify" your guitar playing!

11 a.m. Guitar Styles for Popular Music Instructor: Colin Botts, Grade 8 +. Are you ready to take your guitar playing to the next level? The Intermediate Guitar Class is for guitarists with previous experience who are ready for more challenging and interesting music and technique. The class will cover barre chords, power chords, alternate picking, improvisation, fingerpicking, and ensemble playing.

2 p.m. Beginning Guitar Instructor: Colin Botts, Grade 7 +. Everyone wants to be the life of the party, and now you can by learning to play the guitar! Come learn the basics that you need to know to start playing, including basic open chords, strum patterns, reading tablature, songs, and more. Sign up now and start down the road to *fame and fortune. *Individual results may vary.

2 p.m. Beginning Guitar Instructor: Gary Glass, Grade 6 +. Do you think it would be fun to learn to play guitar? This is the class for you. We'll work on fundamentals to get you started right! No experience necessary to join this class, just an interest in playing the guitar.

PIANO

9 a.m. Advanced Piano, for 5+ years experience Instructor: Tara Johnson, Grade 7 +. Piano skills and performance strategies focus on developing functional keyboard skills through sight reading and ensembles, technique study, and keyboard theory.

2 p.m. Continuing Piano for 2-3 years experience Instructor: Lorie Morgan, Grades 4-6. Have you been playing the piano for a couple of years and would like to further your abilities? We are going to have fun while moving you to the next level in your playing. Maybe you want to improve your sense of rhythm or note reading abilities, or have difficulty with a specific technique, or would like to further improve something you already do well. We will explore all of these possibilities and make some great music together throughout the MAT Camp week!

2 p.m. Intermediate Piano for 3-4 years experience Instructor: Tara Johnson, Grade 6 +. Come learn how to improve your sight-reading and functional keyboard skills, as well as collaborative piano skills in this intermediate piano course.

BLUE SKY PROGRAM

8 a.m., 3 p.m., 4 p.m. Blue Sky for Violin, Viola, Cello, Bass, Mandolin, Guitar. Co-taught by the Blue Sky staff: James Arbizu, Rebecca Lomnicki, David Brewer, Sam Runolfson, Colin Botts, and Adam Hendey. In this three-hour block class, learn how to play in a band from getting to know each to arranging a tune all the way to performance. You will learn how to solo and back up for your Blue Sky Band in a technique class specific for your instrument to prepare you for any future band opportunities. In the technique class, we'll take time to solve specific issues you may have in your band. This block class is hands on experimentation with improvisational scales, chords and tunes you get to arrange with your band. Be prepared to work hard, get out of your "comfort zone," and have a great time. An 8 a.m. Music Industry Panel Class is included in this block.

FOLK MUSIC

9 a.m. Beginning Bodhran Instructor: David Brewer Grade 6 +. Learn one of Ireland's most ancient percussion instruments — the bodhran! You'll learn techniques for holding and using the drum-stick (called a tipper), all of the common rhythms found in Celtic music, techniques for tone changing, and an introduction to analyzing a melody in order to fit a good bodhran part to it. You will get plenty of experience drumming to traditional melodies as well. This class is for beginners, so no musical or drumming experience necessary. "Pizza box bodhrans" will be supplied for class members.

11 a.m. Celtic Playing Style for Flute, Whistle And Other Woodwinds Instructor: David Brewer, Grade 9 +. Experiment with different regional styles of playing the Irish whistle and flute. We will go through an overview of many ornaments, variations, and phrasing techniques that go into each regional style — with some fun learning by ear (although with sheet music for reference). This class is open to any intermediate or advanced wind instrument player.

11 a.m. Scottish Fiddle Tunes and Technique Instructor: Rebecca Lomnicki, Grade 9 +. From the driving West coast highland reels, to the elegant North-East strathspeys, each region of Scotland is known for having its own style and sound. You will learn a variety of traditional tunes as well as the techniques in ornamentation and bowing that make them so particularly Scottish. This class is taught by ear and is for intermediate/advanced fiddle and violin players.

2 p.m. The Session Instructors: David Brewer & Rebecca Lomnicki, Grade 9 +. Play in a traditional Celtic music session! This class is for players of traditional Celtic instruments of intermediate to advanced level. Get experience playing in a session environment, learn new session tunes, and hone the session technique and etiquette of playing in a large group within the style.

ART AND/OR CRAFTS

9 a.m. Altered Books Instructor: JoAnn Memmott, Grade 6 +. Altered Books are a blast to make. Use discarded books and materials (provided) for you to create a NEW work of art. Learn how to make pop-ups, secret pockets, drawers, and more! Class materials fee - \$5.

9 a.m. Watercolor Painting Instructor: Kathy Bella, Grade 6 +. Play and experiment with transparent watercolor paints. Learn some cool tricks to create fun visual effects using salt, plastic wrap, ink, and wax crayons. You will create a little book of eight different watercolor paintings. Class materials fee - \$5.

10 a.m. Oil Painting Techniques Instructor: Eppie Adams, Grade 6 +. Discover the depth of color and flexibility of oil paints. This class teaches the basics of oil painting from the "ground" up. Learn to use techniques and materials like brush strokes, shading, and glazes while painting two pieces of art. Date and place of birth are needed for the "Night Skies" project. Class materials fee - \$15.

11 a.m. Dramatic Portrait Photography Instructor: Kathy Bella, Grade 6 +. We'll turn the classroom into a photo studio and shoot portraits with dramatic lighting. Learn about the manual functions of the camera used to create beautiful, professional looking photographs. Cameras provided. Class materials fee - \$8.

Moore, Grade 6 +. Ever wanted to find a use for all those crumpled up dollar bills? Turn them into works of art! Come learn the amazing art of Japanese paper folding while making new friends. The class fee is for \$1 bills to fold, which you will then take home. Class materials fee - \$10.

1 p.m. Steampunk Art Instructor: JoAnn Memmott, Grades 6-8. Steampunk is a pseudo-Victorian mélange of ideas, notions and possibilities. Come explore the art style of a neo-apocalyptic dystopian future wherein the occupants reside within a quasi-utopian, retro-technological and ideological society (generally while fighting Cthulhu from airships while wearing goggles and corsets). The projects will include a steampunk copper tooling relief, a hat, a pair of goggles, and more. Class materials fee - \$20.

1 p.m. Zentangle Card Making Instructor: Aaron & Kalani Dalton, Grade 6 +. Learn the art of the Zentangle Method of doodling. The Zentangle Method is an easy-to-learn, relaxing, and fun way to create beautiful images by drawing structured patterns. It increases focus and creativity, provides artistic satisfaction along with an increased sense of personal well-being. Class materials fee - \$3.

2 p.m. Batik Instructor: Shelley Piipari-nen, Grade 8 +. Batik is an Indonesian technique of wax-resistant dyeing applied to cloth. Students will create their own design and paint it with colored wax on a piece of fabric, then dye it. Beautiful contrasts and patterns reveal themselves as the wax is ironed out. Class materials fee - \$5.

2 p.m. One Stroke Acrylic Flower Painting Instructor: Judy Hatch, Grade 6 +. Learn to paint beautiful flowers with the one-stroke method of double loading your brush. You will learn to paint flowers, leaves, and stems and how to arrange them, and you will create a finished canvas painting by the end of the week. Class materials fee - \$15.

2 p.m. The Ingenious Illustrator Instructor: Paula Egan-Wright, Grade 9 +. Instant Author-hood! This class appeals to senior high creative writers who also love to doodle and illustrate. We will begin by developing a 12-page book from nearby places and things and then will take sharpies and an empty book on site to draw these places and things on Bristol board. By the last day, everyone will have created an original children's book! Class materials fee - \$5.

3 p.m. Card Making Instructor: Stacey Corbett, Grade 6 +. Cards are more meaningful when they are handmade with love. We will make different cards each day using techniques such as stamping, punching, reverse embossing, and more. You'll also learn how to turn your handmade card into a digital creation that can be mass produced. Also, bring a picture of something that inspires you (an outfit, an interior design, whatever you can find) for your own card design. Class materials fee - \$10.

3 p.m. Celtic Art Instructor: David Brewer, Grade 6 +. What is Celtic art? Learn what Celtic visual art style is and how to make it yourself, including drawing Celtic knot-work and spiral patterns, animals, people, and illuminated hand-writing in fancy calligraphy. All levels of artists welcome! Bring a pencil with eraser, a pen, a drawing-paper notebook with blank paper, and a set of colored pencils. Tracing paper and a calligraphy pen will be provided. Class materials fee - \$15.

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4 p.m. Dress Shirts Redux Instructor: Summer Olsson, Grade 6 +. Turn an oversized men's dress shirt into a runway-worthy fashion statement. You will use everything from needle and thread to hot glue and sequins to transform your own shirt into a dress. Learn how to drape and pin, use a sewing machine, or even just add trim and decorations — the possibilities are endless. No sewing experience necessary, but some might be gained! (Non-dress wearers are welcome; you can turn your shirt into a more fabulous shirt.) Class materials fee - \$10.

4 p.m. The Art of Letter Writing Instructor: Katrina Phillip, Grade 8 +. In this class, you will use your creativity to compose a letter coming straight from your heart. Rediscover the importance and

the art of penmanship and writing in this day of technology and robotics.

8 a.m. Music Industry Panel Class Instructor: James Arbizu, Grade 7 +. Music Industry Panel Class Open to all MAT CAMP students. Learn the details of the music industry from the pros working right here in MAT CAMP.
8 a.m. Supervised Practice Time Instructor: Sara Maisey Grade 7 +.

10 a.m., 11 a.m. Roleplaying Instructors: Aaron & Kalani Dalton, Grade 6 +. CLASSES FOR CHILDREN GRADES 1-2

9 a.m. Felt Hand Puppets Instructor: Summer Olsson, Grades 1-2. Make your own hand puppet and then learn the secrets of puppetry performance. Googly eyes or buttons, a pirate or a princess — you decide! We will use sheet of felt and chunks of foam to form our puppets, create our features, then add details with puffballs, ribbon, bee-bops and doodads.
